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## Report from the Trustees Open Forum held on July 16

Only just over forty residents attended the Forum. Maybe the wet evening deterred some people.

### Gala Day

Jeannine Kolodziejski welcomed everyone and thanked all those involved in organising and contributing to the success of Party in the Park on the previous Saturday. The weather had been kind, at least until early evening, and the event was enjoyed by all those who attended.

### New Trustee

Jeannine also welcomed Frank Stewart as a newly co-opted Trustee. Frank, one of those who volunteered to help us in the earlier part of the year, brought the number of Trustees to four, still one short of the full compliment. She also thanked all our other volunteers, Dorothy Frewer, Sandra Gavin, Arthur Jennings, Mary Long and Brian Leicester for all the work they had put in so far. If you would like to become involved please contact us.

### Bar

Lesley Sharkey said that the Race Night held in the bar had been a success even though it had clashed with the final of "Britain's Got Talent" and was on the hottest day of the year so far which had undoubtedly reduced the numbers attending. Other events are planned for later in the year so keep a look out for advance notices. The food service has been suspended over the summer but will recommence in the autumn with a new menu. Insurance constraints will, unfortunately, prevent us from deep frying but maybe that's not a bad thing from the healthy eating point of view!

### Play Area

Frank then covered our progress on the Play Area project, something we would not have been able to progress without our volunteer team, in particular on this project, Mary Long, who has put in many hours seeking out funding opportunities and contacting other organisations. Our medium term aim is to provide an enlarged and refurbished play area for children of all ages, create a nature trail around the Lagoons area for all to enjoy, make better use of the tennis courts which could become a multi purpose "hard surface" area, look at providing some simple exercise equipment in our larger green areas and thus provide an opportunity for all age groups in the community to benefit from the space in which we live.

We cannot do most of this from our own financial resources and will look for grants from a range of organisations to fund the work. We will need to make a contribution –around 12.5% in most cases- but all of this does not necessarily have to be in cash. It can be in the form of time and voluntary effort or sponsorship. So far we have established contact with our new Council, Cheshire West and Chester, who are being very supportive and we have contacted various equipment suppliers one of which, again, is being very helpful.

It is vital to us winning funding that we have the support of the community. You can help by signing the petition which is available in Reception or with each of the Community Groups all of whom have said that they will look at fundraising opportunities for the project. Ice cream sales at the Party in the Park and a very generous donation of £500 from one resident have got us off to a flying start. Collection buckets for your donations of whatever size are in Reception and in the Bar.

Finally, Frank announced the winners of the children's competition to design their own playground. See elsewhere in this edition for the names of the 3 winners.

This is a medium term project which will need continued hard work to see it through to completion. If you can help in any way at all please contact the Trustees.

### Changing Rooms

Keith Glover updated the meeting on the changing rooms' issue. Unfortunately little progress has been made and we are still waiting to hear from the builder's insurers that their cover is operative. Until this is known we are delaying obtaining Counsel's Opinion. There will be a further update at the OGM. If progress looks like being significantly delayed we will consider some temporary changes to the shower valves.

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## Report from the Trustees Open Forum (cont)

### Budget

Keith then spoke about the budget for next year. All the budget items have been reviewed with Alan Baskerville and whilst there are some up's and some down's we expect to be able to hold contributions for next year at this year's level.

### Lagoons

Keith then moved on to talk about the Lagoons and the management of the amenity lands. Again thanks to our volunteers, this time Arthur Jennings and his team of helpers, the lagoons are now functioning once more. All the leaks and the pump have been repaired; a gate has been fitted to stop unauthorised access to the pump house area and the next job will be to replant the area using the £200 donated by the Community Groups. This is in abeyance until our nature trail plans are firmed up so that we can spend money more effectively.

### Amenity Lands

Some time was then spent discussing the potential outsourcing of the maintenance of the amenity areas. This is covered in detail in a separate note which will be issued to all residents and so will not be repeated here. The note will give residents the opportunity to say whether or not they favour the idea. If a majority of residents do not wish the Trustees to proceed we will shelve the idea.

### Trees and Hedges

Finally, Keith asked all residents who have trees, hedges or other vegetation encroaching over or onto paths, walkways or roads to ensure that they were appropriately trimmed. Shrubs and hedges should be cut back to any footpath edge and where trees or shrubs overhang footpaths they should be cut to a height of at least 2 metres (about 8 feet). If they overhang a road they should be no lower than 3.5 metres (about 11.5 feet). Ray Balmer reminded people that any vegetation around streetlights should be removed.

### Any Other Business

Jeannine then invited comments or questions from the meeting on any topics not covered already. Derek Pearce asked that we ask residents not to park cars on grass verges or other green areas. Can we ask you not to do this please or, indeed to park across footpaths and so preventing pedestrian access. Brian Triffit said that dog fouling was still a problem. PLEASE be a responsible dog owner and clear up after your dog. Remember not doing so is a public order offence with an immediate fine as well as being a health risk, particularly to young children and it isn't difficult to do. The meeting then closed.
