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## Playbuilder

We are grateful for the donation recently received from the ladies of the Water Aerobics group.

Work is continuing on this project. We have met with 3 suppliers and await receipt of their ideas and costs.

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## Broadband Speeds

As you are probably aware Bob Hunt, Iain Martin and Frank Stewart have been collecting signatures and information regarding the poor Broadband speeds available to residents on Delamere Park. Many People have signed a petition which will be forwarded to BT as the provider of the local line plant into the Park.

To support our case with BT, back in July an email was sent to the residents distribution list asking them to take part in a survey of broadband speeds. It asked residents to run a speed test to measure download and then enter their postcode and speed onto a survey form. 73 residents responded and speeds varied between 500k and 3.4M. The average speed on the Park was just over 2M

For each postcode area we have plotted the speed BT say is possible against the speed recorded by a resident in that postcode. This is shown on a Google Map page which can be accessed here <http://tinyurl.com/r47yog>

We were also able to find out the mix of broadband providers on the park and this is shown below.

Once all the information has been fully collated then Bob Hunt will forward this to BT in an attempt to persuade them to take action to upgrade the local line plant or to upgrade the exchange equipment to allow for faster speeds.

We will keep you posted on our progress.

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## Our Park

This is everyone's home and we all need to share responsibility for keeping The Park to the standard we all want to enjoy.

### Dog Fouling

Dog fouling is not only illegal on amenity lands but a health hazard to everyone. The Dog's [Fouling of Land] Act 1996 applies to all the amenity land on The Park. This makes it an offence not to remove, straight away, any faeces deposited by your dog on amenity land. Failure to do so carries a maximum penalty of £1,000 and a subsequent criminal record if found guilty of the offence.

Instances of dog fouling can be reported directly to Cheshire West and Chester Council, STREETSCENE group on 0300 1238123 and any photographs of a dog fouling can be uploaded and emailed directly to the address below who will take action to identify the owner and deal with the offence [columbmcphillips@cheshirewestandchester.gov.uk](mailto:columbmcphillips@cheshirewestandchester.gov.uk). Dogs should not be allowed to roam unsupervised, legally the dog wardens can and do seize unsupervised dogs, the cost of recovering the dog being born by the owner.

### Trees and Hedges

A reminder that residents who have trees, hedges, or other vegetation encroaching over or onto paths, walkways or roads to ensure they are appropriately trimmed. Shrubs and hedges should be cut back to any footpath edge. Where trees and shrubs overhang footpaths they must be cut to a height of 2 metres, if they overhang a road they must be no lower than 3.5 metres.

### Vandalism

There have been a number of acts of vandalism around the Park including the play area. Sad to say that following all the good work done by the volunteers on the Lagoons to get them back to a good state of repair litter and debris has subsequently been dumped into them. The entrance area to the Club House is constantly left in an unpleasant state due to both litter being dropped and other acts of neglect and vandalism. Please be mindful that we all share the surroundings of The Park and its incumbent upon everyone to play their part in ensuring the upkeep is kept to highest standard.

### Buying services from Passing Traders (Door Stop Callers)

You may feel under pressure or tempted because of price to buy services or goods from door stop callers. Of course there are several reasons for not doing so. Think carefully about who you are employing and inviting into your home. It is better to obtain services from local traders and suppliers that you know or friends know & recommend. There is a list of recommended traders held at Reception.

To report such callers please ring the police on the appropriate number below and/or Trading Standards on 0845 113 2500.
