Residents' Survey

A huge thank you to everyone who took the trouble to complete the Residents' Survey. Overall there was a 54 % response rate, which for this type of study is an exceptionally good response. By comparison in 2006, the last time a study was conducted, the response was just 38%.

The study has produced a lot of valuable information, and we have arranged a session to in the Park Room to present a summary of the findings. This will take place after the summer holidays on **Wednesday September 1 at 7.30pm**. In addition, we will produce a special edition of Park Talk, which will provide a summary of the findings.

Business Activity and Communication

The Trustees meet monthly to discuss all issues affecting the Park and to manage the business of DPML. Look out for details of the Ordinary General Meeting of Plot Owners which will be held on September 16, when you will receive a report on all activities and consider the Budget, Development Plans and Plot Holder contributions for 2010/11. A Trustee will be regularly attending the Community Group meeting to listen to views and keep all groups informed about what is going on.

As well as a regular update in Parktalk, the Trustees will hold a minimum of three Residents' Open Forums in the year to listen to views and give information about progress on projects. All major projects in the future will involve residents in their development and will be publicised to afford an opportunity for views to be expressed.

Club Rebuilding Outstanding Issues

We have been in discussion with the builders of the clubhouse on the remedial works required. They will carry out these works at their expense to put right the problems with the changing rooms and pool area. Whilst this work is being done, we will take the opportunity to improve the drainage and ventilation of the changing rooms to create a more comfortable environment. We also plan to fit improved shower valves and doors to the cubicles, the current ones having not proved satisfactory.

We anticipate that the work will be carried out in September and will take about two weeks. During the works we shall obviously have to close the pool and changing rooms but will give you as much notice as possible once the exact dates are agreed.

Children's Play Area

Phase One

Subject to weather conditions, the painting of original structures, together with repairs to the timber of the existing tower, is expected to be completed before the end of July. A big thank you to all the volunteers who have carried out this work and planned the improvements.

Phase Two

The installation of new equipment in Phase Two is expected by mid August. The volunteers are working closely with the suppliers to ensure that we have a wider range of play equipment for our younger park residents.

Tree Policy

In response to a request in the last Park Talk, a number of residents have met with a Trustee to develop a tree policy. This will establish a clear plan and programme for our trees over a three year period. Work is currently underway to record all trees and expert advice will be sought in the completion of the plan. A Draft Policy will be prepared for the early Autumn with an opportunity provided for residents to comment on before the plan is finalised.

World Cup

The World Cup is over and despite the obvious disappointment over the early departure of England, the Residents' Club has been a hive of activity during all of the main matches. The Trustees wish to thank all those who have made this event a huge success.

Bye Laws

The Trustees have reviewed the existing Bye Laws, and in several places this document is clearly very out of date. Consequently, these have been updated to reflect the current position.

The main changes that have taken place are the following:

1. The old document included a section on the sauna, which we no longer have, so it has been taken out!
2. The Bye Laws were inconsistent with the current bar rules and these have now been aligned.
3. Previously, there was no acknowledgement we now have an Estate Manager (Alan Baskerville), who can give approval to certain requests in the absence of trustees and this will allow for a faster response.
4. The notice User Groups need to give for room bookings has been relaxed.

Dogs

Dog fouling is not only illegal on amenity lands but a health hazard to everyone. The Dog's Fouling of Land Act 1996 applies to all the amenity land on the Park. This makes it an offence not to remove **immediately**, any faeces deposited by your dog on amenity land. Despite these possible penalties, dog fouling continues to be a problem on the Park. Parents, please ensure that if your child takes the family dog out that they have the necessary bags with them to clear up after their pet.

For example, a swimmer might be fit to swim front crawl for an hour, but couldn't jog for ten minutes. Circuit training is for general fitness. 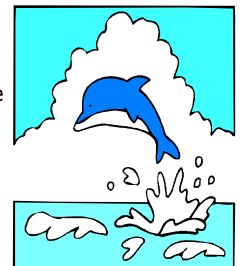
