Annual Meeting of Plotholders

A well attended annual plotholder meeting was held in September, which proved to be one of the shortest on record! All the resolutions were approved, and there were no special proposals to discuss.

Although there were no new trustee nominations, three trustees were required to seek election. Martin Cutbill and Chris Hardy had been co-opted during the course of the past year and needed to be formally elected, and Jeannine Kolodziejski's tenure as a trustee has lasted so long as to require re-election. All were successfully elected. At the meeting Bob Hunt very kindly proposed a vote of thanks to the trustees.

While Jeannine Kolodziejski was keen to continue as a Trustee she has stepped down as Chairperson. At a subsequent Trustee meeting it was agreed that Martin Cutbill be appointed as the new Chairperson.

Residents' Survey

Last month the results of the Residents' Survey was presented, and a special edition of Parktalk was produced, summarising the findings. This was not distributed door to door, however if you would like a copy this can be obtained from reception. The Trustees will progress the actions arising and these will be reported in subsequent Parktalks.

Children's Play Area

The refurbishing some of the older equipment and installing a number of new pieces of equipment is now complete and improves the experience of our younger residents.

The funding for this was achieved by various means; utilising some of the DP budget, grants from the Parish Council, Cheshire West and Chester, the DPML User groups, Littlers Butchers, and fund raising from younger residents themselves.

There was a slight delay in August as asbestos was found at the site of the new equipment, however this was swiftly and safely removed. The trustees would like to thank all the volunteers who helped achieve this, with special thanks to Mary Long for "Project Managing" the project from start to finish.

Changing Rooms

Meetings with the original builders (Cleggs) of the Club House have continued with a view to implementing remedial work to the changing rooms. We believe that we have reached agreement with the builder regarding this and are currently waiting the specification of works. As well as the remedial work the Trustees have requested from the builder, a quote for some additional enhancement work around ventilation and floor drainage within the changing rooms. Again we are currently awaiting the quote and will advise residents as to when this work will take place as soon as we are in a position to do so.

It is inevitable that when the work goes ahead it will require the swimming pool and changing rooms to be closed, and we will make every effort to keep this as short as possible. We would like to take this opportunity to thank Keith Glover for all his efforts in helping resolve these outstanding issues.

Tree Policy and Programme

Following two successful meetings with interested residents a final draft of the tree Policy has been prepared and will be presented to the Trustees for ratification. Work is currently underway with our Tree Specialist to establish the 3 Year Programme of felling, pruning and re-planting. This Programme will be made available for inspection by residents during October. It is the intention of the Trustees to maintain a rolling three year programme to help ensure that the trees on Delamere Park are healthy and contribute to the unique environment we all enjoy.

In order to give residents more opportunities to discuss areas of interest with Trustees forums are to be held on a regular basis. The first of these will take place on Wednesday November 3. Exercise Classes

Being fit is the interaction of all the muscles in your body working together to complete a specific task, and the fitter you are, the easier that task will be. It is about your fitness being functional. This means that some people may be 'fit' in just one aspect of physical activity. For example, a swimmer might be fit to swim front crawl for an hour, but couldn't jog for ten minutes. Circuit training is for general fitness. All our classes are suitable for a wide range of fitness levels, and can easily be adapted for any individual targets you may have. Come along and have a chat and try it out.

All classes take place in the Park Room and cost £3 per session.

Pilates Circuit for Beginners and Improvers — Thursdays 09:30 to 10:30

Pilates is an approach to exercise which focuses on toning, balance and mobility. This circuit will help you develop your core stability muscles, increase muscular endurance, increase joint mobility and stability, help postural alignment, help reduce injuries and muscular back pain. **Low impact**, No jumping or aerobics. **High effect**, toning, mobility and balance.

What to wear - anything comfortable and stretchy – trainers or bare feet

Body Balance Exercise with Music Circuit - Mondays 10:00 to 11:00

Specially designed for Women - Gently tone and stretch your whole body - each session. This circuit is for anyone who wants to begin exercising at their own pace – help lose a few pounds – become more healthy – tone and shape their muscles – increase endurance – increase their aerobic capacity - increase joint mobility, stability and flexibility – help postural alignment – help reduce injuries or muscular back pain - have some fun whilst exercising.

General Circuit Training for Men and Women age 15 plus - Mondays 18:00 to 19:00 except Bank Holidays Thursdays 19:00 to 20:00

General fitness training for all abilities. 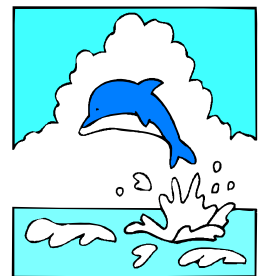
Thursday classes will commence the week after the AGM which will be 23rd September when we hope to welcome our group members old and new.
