#### Park Hedgehogs

By the time of this Winter/December newsletter all sensible hedgehogs should be hibernating; if you've provided the right sort of conditions in your garden they may have chosen yours!

But what is hibernation?

Hedgehogs hibernate as a means of survival - it slows down their use of energy as their natural food becomes more scarce in winter.

They will choose the place to hibernate very carefully; log piles, leaf piles, compost heaps, under your shed, or in your hedgehog house. Somewhere that's dark and hidden with a cold, stable temperature. Normally they will remain there until next spring.

Hibernation is a complicated and often perilous energy conservation strategy. It is not just 'going to sleep.' In sleep all bodily functions remain nearly normal but in hibernation the metabolism is almost at a standstill.

Their body temperature drops to match their surroundings and they enter a state of torpor. This allows them to save a lot of energy, and all other bodily functions, including heart rate and breathing, will slow dramatically.



The hedgehog's fuel supply comes from the fat stores it has built up over the summer and autumn. Eating enough before hibernation is vital – a weight of at least 600 grams is usually necessary in order to survive.

However, hibernation is not always a continuous process. In milder periods hogs may stir and come out of their hibernacle looking for food - but there won't be much natural food about. This is where we can all help, and hopefully ensure more hogs on the Park in 2023! Keep an eye out for them during this winter.

Put out small amounts of food regularly - a bowl of kitten or senior cat biscuits (rabbit or poultry flavour) will be very well received. Don't forget a shallow dish of water too. If you are gardening take care in case you come across one hibernating – DO NOT DISTURB!
