Park Hedgehogs

2023 has been a difficult year for hedgehogs. Numbers on the Park seem to have declined, and I haven't seen one in my garden for over three months.

Helen Gill, who runs the Northwich Hedgehog Rescue, told me recently this problem is quite widespread locally, due mainly to the very hot and dry spells of weather we've had this year.

At these times hedgehogs struggle to find enough food because the invertebrates on which they feed are in short supply, and sources of vitally important drinking water have dried up. If you have seen hedgehogs, or like me your 'hogs have disappeared, I'd like to know about it so I can monitor the situation on the whole of Delamere Park.

At this time of year, hedgehogs that have survived will be preparing for hibernation. They will choose a place to hibernate very carefully: under log piles, in leaves under a shrub or hedge, in compost heaps, under your shed, or in your hedgehog house. Somewhere that's dark and hidden with a cold, stable temperature. Normally they will remain there until next spring. However, hibernation is not always a continuous process. In milder periods 'hogs may stir and come out of their hibernacle looking for food - but there won't be much natural food about.

This is where we can all help, and hopefully ensure more 'hogs on the Park in 2024!

Keep an eye out for them during this coming winter.

- Put out small amounts of food regularly a bowl of kitten biscuits (rabbit or poultry flavour) will be very well received. Don't forget a shallow dish of water too.
- If you are gardening take care in case you come across one hibernating

DO NOT DISTURB!

Finally, thank you to all those residents who are continuing to bring me their used/unwanted newspapers, instead of putting them in the CWAC recycling bin. I then take them to Northwich Hedgehog Rescue for Helen to use as bedding for the hedgehogs in their little 'hutches'. Please keep them coming, it's a much more useful way of recycling!
