Squirrels Pre-school are delighted to announce that we will be opening Monday-Friday from 2nd September 2020 and still have some spaces available for children aged 2-5 years old. We have implemented a very thorough risk assessment, and are confident that our setting complies with all the local authority and Government guidelines required to operate safely. We would like to thank everyone who has supported us during this very strange and unprecedented crisis especially the parents, our staff, DPML Trustees and DP plot-holders.

As well as providing much needed day care for the children of 'key workers' living on Delamere Park (and in the surrounding area) during the Covid-19 "Lockdown"; Squirrels have made some much needed improvements to the Lodge/Schoolroom. We have painted and decorated both rooms (many thanks to the committee members, plot-holders and staff who helped), put up new notice boards, and had new radiators installed in the school room. The old wooden doors at the' main entrance are being replaced with a brand new double glazed, frosted glass double door. The front and both sides of wooden cladding are being replaced with new brown UPVC cladding which will improve the appearance and the thermal efficiency of the building. All these improvements have been funded by Squirrels preschool through fundraising and a hard-won government grant. We do hope that everyone on the Park will approve of the work we have had done and look forward to welcoming our new intake of 'baby Squirrels' in September.
