#### **Delamere Parkway West:**

#### The Cobbles:

They've made a hedgehog highway hole in their gate and hogs have come into the

#### Long Acre (not my garden!):

A hedgehog has built a den of leaves, grass, moss and general loose vegetation



in a corner between a roof tile and the wall.

This was built in early October, so I'm sure that the den will be used as a place for him/her to hibernate – it may well

be occupied by the time this newsletter is circulated.

Please keep an eye out for hedgehogs during the winter. Hibernation is not a continuous process, so in milder periods 'hogs may stir and come out of their hibernacle looking for food - there won't be many slugs about so a bowl of cat biscuits will be very well received.


A theatre outing has been organised to see 'Calendar Girls' and in February there is a trip to see 'Jersey Boys' in Manchester.
