News from The Trustees

Spring is about to arrive on the Park and this year it will herald the start of work on some of the major projects we have all being looking forward to. And I would like to start by giving an update on the Pool Refurbishment project. You agreed at the AGM last year to proceed with the project and since then our consulting engineers, Hopkins Coats, who you will remember were engaged to manage the project on our behalf, have produced a detailed specification and drawings. The work has been tendered and we now have a preferred contractor. However the tenders have come in very much higher than the original estimate that we were given for the work and for this reason the Trustees have decided to call a meeting of Plot Owners at short notice so that all the facts can be put before you and to give you the opportunity to ask questions before we proceed. The Trustees, the Estate Manager and Hopkins Coats all want to press on with the work and are satisfied that the tender process was robust and that the price of the preferred bidder represents market value. We will be contacting you shortly to provide you with more information and to notify you of the date and time of the meeting.

You will have noticed that the play area has been cleared. This is because a health and safety check identified defects (mainly rotten timbers) with the existing play equipment. A drawing of how the new play area will look is on display in the Clubhouse and work is due to commence on Monday 6th March.

If you have been in the Clubhouse recently you will also have noticed, that in response to your feedback, we now display an organisation chart identifying Trustees and staff of Delamere Park Management.

Finally I would like to thank all the employees of DPML and volunteers for their excellent work and with the aftermath of storm Doris fresh in our minds a special thank you to the gardeners for the efficient way they dealt with the fallen trees on the park.

News from Estates Manager (Steve Hayes)

Repairs and Maintenance

A series of repairs has been carried out throughout December and January including principally, emergency repairs to Squirrels / Lodge following the removal of asbestos. Residents will be aware of the extent of damage to the property that was incurred and the difficulty in sourcing contractors over the Christmas period to make good. However, we did manage to reopen the facility on 9th January. In addition we have carried out a number of electrical repairs to emergency light fittings throughout the site. Also further roof repairs were undertaken above the squash courts. I am awaiting prices for a full roof replacement but the repairs undertaken so far have been reasonably successful and bought us a little time to set funds aside for the future.

We have had some issues with the pool filtration pumps and these were replaced last week. The new pumps are more efficient and use less electricity than the previous ones so we should see some energy savings over the next few months.

Projects

1.Pool Hall, Plant Room and Shower <u>Refurbishment</u>

The project tender documents have been issued to 5 companies and are due back on 10th February. The timetable is then as follows:

Appointment of contractor	· 17 th February
Lead in period	4 weeks
Commence on site	20 th March
Works duration	10 / 12 weeks
Project completion	early June

There will be some disruption in reception area but it will be cordoned off adjacent the pool hall. It is my intention whilst the work is being undertaken to partially drain the pool, replace all missing mosaic tiles and professionally clean the pool tank. In addition I would take the opportunity to replace the pool hall lights with LED specification ones.

2. IT upgrade

The IT upgrade project has now been completed with all PCs networked and using the latest version of Office 365. We now have a connection with the gardener's compound so can communicate electronically with them. Also we have full control of the website and are able to upload documents and amend pages directly from the office rather than relying on the good offices of Andrew Long.

3. Play Area

The new play area equipment which was approved at the last Trustees meeting is being constructed off site and will be ready for installation in March. Displays of the new equipment are posted in the reception. We have managed to obtain a grant of £3,000 towards the cost of the play area from the local council and DPML would like to thank them for their contribution towards this project.
