News from The Trustees

Since the last newsletter, the trustees and DPML management have all been working hard to continue providing a service that we can both be proud of and quite rightly expect. I would therefore like to update you on several issues that are subject to the result of misinformation and rumour from around the Park. The trustees feel it is now time to set the record straight.

1. Since, the SGM in May and the resolution to keep the Grounds Maintenance in-house, we have been working hard to put in place the necessary changes that over time will deliver what we believe will be an improved quality/level of service. This has included; - a change in management style, the creation of a new Steering group to help define new working schedules and objectives, regular review meetings and a greater focus on what is being delivered. We have developed and implemented a new summer work schedule (to be used until September), that will be monitored and evolved over the coming weeks, whilst also looking into what is required from an autumn/winter schedule.

2. As a result of planting trees on the verges of Delamere Park Way West, DPML and your trustees are being taken to court on 14th September by one of our residents to force the estate to remove them, as they are un-wanted. The Trustees and DPML, vigorously contest this action as we take our responsibilities seriously and understand our duty to protect the layout and aesthetics of the "common" land around the Park. In our opinion, and I hope the majority of residents agree, it is the abundance of trees and quality of the common land that attracted us to the estate in the first place.

3. Squirrels pre-school nursery. Over the last few months many inaccuracies have been spread around the Park relating to the treatment of Squirrels and their usage of the Lodge. As part of an initiative to improve upon the level of activities available to children on the Park, the trustees agreed, that in addition to Squirrels, an alternative user group would be allowed access to use the Lodge during holiday periods to run a children's club. At this time Squirrels did not see providing this additional service as part of their portfolio. Unfortunately, this has created a lot of unnecessary animosity and ill feeling. The trustees see the extra service being offered as a real and positive addition to the Park and want to encourage such activities that support the enhancement of the Park. In order to try and resolve these issues, DPML have proposed the setting up of separate management agreements between each group and the estate to clarify both their relationship with the estate and agree terms. As part of this agreement the trustees are also requesting that the two primary groups cover the basic running costs of the Lodge and that the policy of past trustees not to enforce the terms and costs of the previous lease is re-assessed. Currently, Squirrels are using the Lodge on the back of a lease dated in 2010, with an annual rent of £12 and a requirement to pay all associated bills. Whilst, they have been paying for the gas and their own telephone/broadband line, no other utilities/rates etc. have been re-charged. Over the last few years DPML, (before one off costs /improvements to the building, which amounted to £12k last year) have been subsidising the use of the Lodge to the tune of approximately £2000 per annum. The trustees feel fully justified in raising the question of whether this continued support is justified, both within the current economic climate and in light of the number of Park children benefiting from the service.

News from Estates Manager

I would like to update residents regarding recent maintenance events. There have been issues with water pressure to the header tank serving the showers. As this equipment is still under warranty Hopkins Coats / Trentons were contacted for repairs to or replacement of the unit concerned. Once it was established that the issue was not connected to the incoming supply pressure then contractors arrived to resolve the issue. The cause was a small piece of plastic and a build up of debris in the booster tank which prevented the tank valve from opening and thereby stopping it from re-filling. This has now been resolved.

On Saturday 11th August I was called to site as there was a burning smell emanating from the pool plant room. On entering the room I found a small rubber ball which had been forced into the circulation pipework and had caused one of the pool pumps to overheat and burn out. The object was removed and power to the building was restored. However the pool remained closed until a new pump could be fitted. This was completed on Monday13th August and the pool re-opened. I would like to request to all residents using the pool to observe the byelaw which calls for no ball games in the pool area.

The Planned Preventative Maintenance regime continues to identify and rectify minor maintenance issues before they become significant.

A number of light fittings have been replaced with LED in the reception corridor.

The tennis court cable supporting the net has been replaced on no.2 court.

The newly formed Events Group will be arranging new events and activities for residents following a number of requests. Be sure to look out for further information on the notice boards and in leaflets available from reception.

I would like to remind residents that a Rijo branded coffee machine is available in reception which offers speciality coffees, tea and hot chocolate at prices well below the equivalent offering at Costa Coffee, Starbucks, café Nero etc so please come along and try them after a swim or other visit.
