We are approaching a busy time on the Park with the opening of the refurbished swimming pool imminent, Gala Day approaching on the 9th September and the AGM of Plot-owners called for the 21st September.

We have new changing rooms and showers and the pool has been re-tiled. Behind the scenes is where the big money has been spent in installing a state of the art ventilation system, new drains, two new industrial boilers and the control systems to make all this work. We now have swimming facilities that are second to none. The work has been completed on time and slightly under budget, no mean achievement, for which we must thank in particular our Estate Manager Steve Hayes, Ian Sharp the lead Trustee for the project, the consulting engineers and contractors.

If you haven't seen the new pool I'd encourage you to go down to the Clubhouse and take a look and make sure you've got your swimming things with you because once you've viewed the facilities you'll want to use them!

You may have seen the flyers for Gala Day which list some of the exciting activities on offer on the day. Some very hard work has gone on in the background to bring this event to you and I'd like to thank all the volunteers and DPML staff for their hard work and would encourage everybody to support the event

Put in your calendars the 21st September, the date of the DPML AGM of Plotowners. Make sure your vote counts. If you're unable to attend on the night you can still vote by completing your voting slip and handing it into the Office. If you're unsure about how to do this, ask at the Office, they'll be happy to explain everything. This is your opportunity to help shape DPML policy and have your say in how your plot fee is spent. News from Estates Manager (Steve Hayes)

"As I write this article the major project refurbishing the pool hall, plant room and changing rooms is drawing to an end. This completes a list of projects undertaken over the past few months unprecedented since the 'great fire of Delamere Park'.

It is our intention to re-open the pool on the 21st August on time and under budget providing all goes well with the final commissioning programme. We now have a pool we can be proud of which will serve us for many years into the future. It is hard to appreciate the true complexity of this project. The scale of the works in the boiler room and the gigantic ventilation plant sited in the specially strengthened loft area were significant achievements. It's not easy to bring a project of this size and complexity in on time and under budget but with goodwill and co-operation all round has helped and I would like to thank all residents for their patience whilst this work was underway.

But it doesn't stop there. The asbestos removal work and refurbishment of the Lodge building was completed earlier in the

New playground facilities were finished and have proved popular with the younger residents of the Park.

The new beer garden outside the bar has proved a popular spot for residents to relax and chat over a drink on the warmer summer days.

New industrial boilers have been installed in the plant room lowering our energy costs and improving the reliability of our heating.

Work has progressed on the Lagoons with resident and outside volunteer participation, including planting and repair of the pump.

The Office computer network has been upgraded and extended to better manage our administration and communications.

We maintained a varied programme of events (with the significant help of volunteers), including: Bonfire Night and the Children's Christmas Party and as I am writing this I am looking forward to a new look Gala Day including bands, fish and chips, a dog show, face painting and other

All in all a year of achievement."
